Promoting Resilience Across Europe



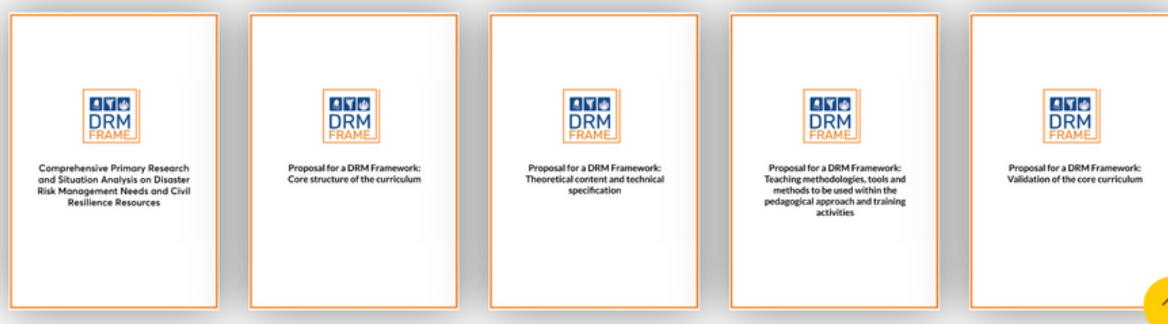

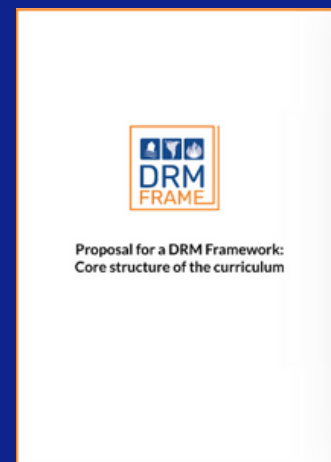




Deliverables Spotlight: WP3 Curriculum Framework

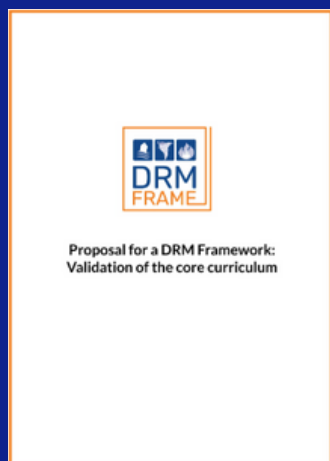


WP3.2 – Theoretical Content and Technical Specifications
